2.1,1 Curricular Planning and Implementation:	 The college adopts academic calendar and curriculum prepared by the university. A few teachers are member of BOS.

2.2.1 Student Enrolment and Profile:	 The college follows a transparent admission process in accordance with the eligibility criteria and rules of the State Government and university. Admission process is advertised through newspapers and website. Efforts should be made to increase number of admissions in each programme.
2.2.2 Catering to Student Diversity:	 The college provides financial assistance to differently-abled students like physically, visually and economically challenged students. The college is catering to the educational needs of poor and backward class of society. The college organizes Fresher's Day programme for new comers. Tutorial and remedial classes are organized for slow learners, however it lacks to formalize appropriate time schedule for this.
2.2.3 Teaching-Learning Process:	 Academic calendar, teaching planning is designed in the beginning of the year in coordination with IQAC. SUMANA, a counselling Centre in the institution provides academic, personal, emotional and social support to the students. Learning through ICT should be incorporated in regular teaching.
2.2.4 Teacher Quality:	 Only 4 faculties have Ph.D. and eight are pursuing. The vacant positions need to be filled. Need to organise more National and State Level Seminars. Limited faculties serve as resource persons and are representing their college in various workshops, seminars and conferences.
2.2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms:	 Internal Assessment for continuous evaluation of students is followed. A mechanism for grievance redressal is in place. Transparent Valuation system followed.

2.3.7 Collaborations	 The college has made few formal collaboration with some social organizations. It has also signed two MOUs with two industries, but formal activities yet to be started.
2.4 Infrastructure and Learning Resources:	
2.4.1 Physical Facilities:	 The college has adequate space for academic and administrative activities. The college has spacious laboratories, need to be rejuvenated. The ramp facilities for differently abled students are not in place. Hostel facilities for girls and boys are not available.
2.4.2 Library as a Learning Resource:	 The Library has a stock of 15977 books with a sitting capacity of 100 students. The library has INFLIB NET facility The library does not prescribe to any other e-resources
2.4.3 IT Infrastructure	 The college has in all 57 computers. IT facilities are available in the campus with a scope of further expansion. Softwares need upgradation with latest configurations. Limited accessibility of computer and internet facility to the students. The provision for audio-visual facilities needs to be strengthened.
