APS College of Arts and Science organized various activities to educate and create awareness among the students.

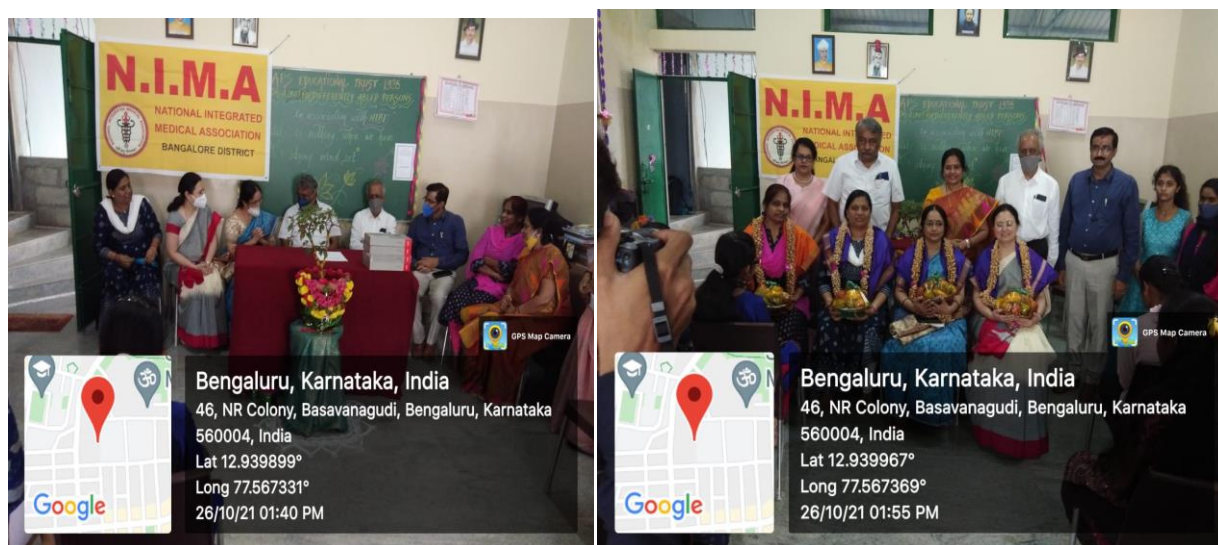
- Azadi ka Amrut Mahotsava was conducted on 13<sup>th</sup> August 2021. Mrs. Vasanthi K. was the convener of the program. Chief Guest and Resource person Dr. Pampa Devi, Professor of History threw light on the history of freedom struggle and sacrifices made by leaders and general public alike. Students were made to understand the challenges faced by India with respect to socio-economic inequality, discrimination and so on even after Independence.
- On the eve of 75<sup>th</sup> Independence Day, 6/6 Coy, a National Webinar was organized on 14<sup>th</sup> August 2021 by Virtual mode. The topic was 'National Integration – Freedom and Responsibility', co-ordinated by Dr. Loksha, NCC Officer in association with Karnataka Battalion, NCC Bangalore 'B' group. Chief Guest and Resource person Mr. Arun P.G. ACP Hawaldar briefly explained the imperatives of National Integration, present issues & challenges towards National Integration in India. 85 students and faculty participated via Zoom platform.
- Independence Day was celebrated by ceremonial flag hoisting. Smt. Snehal Raimane, Director, Pre-university Education, Govt. Of Karnataka was the Chief Guest. NCC Cadets and NSS Volunteers actively participated in the march past. APSET board members, Trustees, Principal, teaching and non-teaching staff and the students participated with patriotic fervor.
- Founders Day and Teachers Day were celebrated together on 5/9/2021. Dr. Padmini Prasad noted Gynecologist & Dr. Puthurai, Kannada writer were the Chief Guests for the function. Role of NEP in Exploring Possibilities in the Redesigned structure of higher education with respect to graduate courses. It created awareness on Outcome Based Education, graduate attributes, Blooms Taxonomy and Learner Centric approach. The talk given by Dr. Gowreesha was well appreciated and received by the faculty participants. Technical sessions post lunch were held by Prof. Rajkumar B. N, Assistant Prof. R. V. Teachers College and Dr. A. RamaPrasad, Principal, Jnana Vikas Institute of Technology and trustee, APSET, and they enlightened everyone, about the role of NEP in reforming Educational systems at all levels. The Workshop helped all the faculties to understand the NEP structure and content. After the technical session the Valedictory was held. The Chief Guest Dr. B. - NSS Foundation Day was organized on 24/9/2021 by NSS volunteers and Officer Mr. Hareesha. A plantation drive was held in the college premises as a mark of NSS Foundation Day celebration. Principal, Faculty and Students actively participated.
- Gandhi Jayanthi was celebrated on 2/10/21 by customary garlanding of Mahatma Gandhiji's photo. Floral tributes were paid. NSS volunteers and NCC Cadets along with their program officers visited Belaku Shishu Nivasa, Sai Vrudhashrama and Abalashrama and distributed fruits to the inmates as mark of Gandhi Jayanthi. The purpose was to develop care and concern for socially abandoned members. Also to instill a sense of security among the inmates.
- Inauguration of first year classes was conducted on 12/10/2021. A model structure of NEP-2020 with core subjects and open elective subjects, as per BCU was presented to students to make them aware of possibilities of the New Education policy.
- To mark the Kannada Rajyostava, commemorating the statehood a Samuhika Kannada Geetha Gayana Karyakrama (Group Singing of Kannada state songs) was held on 28/10/2021 by NSS Volunteers and NCC Cadets. The objective was to inculcate the love and respect for Kannada language and regional culture by Kannada Department. Theme of this program was 'Matad Matad Kannada' which means everyone should learn and speak in Kannada language. General Secretary Sri A R Acharya stressed everyone to speak Kannada and also advised to propagate Kannada Culture. Principal Dr. B. Students from different colleges in the city were invited to witness and participate in the discussion. World Disabled Day 2021 was organized on 03.12.2021

Smt Ashwini Angadi, Youth courage Awardee, UNO, and Sri Kaladegula Srinivas, famous cine artist and anchor graced the occasion as Chief Guest. All the members of APSE Trust were present and encouraged the students. 10 Laptops were distributed to visually impaired students. Karan V student of PG Economics led a group song that highlighted the inner strength and spirits of differently abled.



- Inauguration of Weekly Assembly as a Best Practice was conducted on 8/12/2021. The Inaugural event was held by the Department of PG students (Economics). Principal advised the gathering about the importance of assembly. Departmental achievements, NCC, NSS, YRC, Sports, NEP, Yoga and scholarship news was presented by students. The objective of holding weekly assembly was to encourage stage performance, enhance confidence, and communication and presentation skills among all students. #### **STUDENT REPORT**

An online training program was conducted from 15<sup>th</sup> February 2022 to 19<sup>th</sup> February 2022 and 20 B.Sc students were selected for the training. - NSS Unit organized its Annual Camp on the theme '**Cleanliness and Service**' for Village development from 09/05/2022 to 15/05/2022. The Program was inaugurated by Professor K. P Narasimha Murthy, President, APSET. He spoke on the main objective and importance of the NSS program. Dr. B. Jayashree, Principal, APS College of Arts and Science addressed and gave details and goals of the program and urged the participants to make this 7 days program successful with their active participation and involvement. The program was graced by Chief Guest, Sri Ravikumar, member of Cheluru Village Panchayath. He appreciated the College and NSS unit for organizing the camp for cleanliness of the Village which is special and noteworthy.

The camp was housed in Shri Ramana Maharshi School for Blind, at Tungani village. Sri Mahadev, Managing Director, GESCOM explained about the harvest, storage and transmission of solar power to KPTCL (Karnataka power transmission Corporation Limited) through grids.

In the afternoon, the road leading to Shri Tirumurthy village development center was cleaned. At around 4 p.m., Mrs. Vasanthi k., Associate Professor of Sociology spoke on 'Role of women in rural development' and shared her valuable thoughts. At 6.30 pm the flag was dehoisted. At 7.30 p.m. cultural activities were organized involving NSS volunteers.

On Wednesday, 11/05/2022, from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m., plants at Shri Tirumurthy village development center were nurtured by forming basins in soil bed, for the retention of water. At 4 p.m., Entrepreneur, Vidushi Mrs. Jalpa Mahadev B.E (EEE), M.S (USA) delivered a special talk on applications of music in day to day life. She demonstrated the 7 notes of music to students through her Bharatanatyam performance and urged them to learn music for NSS service and to apply it in their day today life. Subsequently, Chief Guest, Vidwan, Mr. Suchit Rajgopal, explained unique ways of learning 7 notes of Music and the path to learn about the distance between the earth and sun through Kirtanas of Purandaradasa. He also provided insights into the way musical notes can be used to cure many diseases and how the art of Music can contribute to mental health and well-being. This special talk program was graced by President of Cheluru Village Panchayath, Smt. Shobha Devi, Panchayat member. Principal, Dr. B. Jayashree presided over the function.

In connection to this, plants in the public park were nurtured by clearing out the weeds and forming basins in soil bed for water retention. At 4.30 p.m. Resource Person, Ms Sona Bai M., Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry, APS Arts and Science College, delivered a special talk on **Use of solar energy in villages and its importance.**

On 13/05/2022 morning, after flag hoisting by Shri Dhandathane, Incharge of Development Center, Yoga was practiced at Shri Tirumurthy Village Development center. Shramadaan was conducted by clearing up the weeds at Sports ground. At 4:30 p.m., Resource Person, Shri Kiran Raj, General Secretary, JET group and Ralph institution addressed the NSS volunteers on personality development through social service and highlighted the importance of social service to develop one's personality. Later, Shri Kantharaj, Assistant Professor, Department of History shared his experience and memories of special NSS camps during his student life. In the evening at 6.30 pm the flag was dehoisted. On 14/05/2022, Saturday morning after the flag hoisting and physical exercises, the Volunteers engaged in deweeding excessively grown vegetation around hostels of the blind students.

Subsequently, the larger grits in the playground were removed. In the evening, Resource Person, Lieutenant Dr. Loksha A., Assistant Professor, Department of Economics (Post-Graduation), APS College spoke on the topic **Indian Economy, Challenges and Solutions**. He explained the volunteers about the current economic trend of India and emphasized that Indian economy can be built stronger and secure through social service. At 7.30 p.m., a cultural program was presented by students of Ramana Maharishi School for the Blind and NSS Volunteers.

On 15/05/22, the concluding day, after the flag hoisting, Shramdaan was conducted by making pits around, adding fertilizers and watering for more than 50 varieties of fruits bearing plants namely lemon, pomegranate, guava, blackberry, coconut, Jackfruit, teak etc. Later at 1.30 p.m., Shri B. Nijalingappa, Retired Officer, Indian Forest Service (IFS), inaugurated the program by planting a sapling and watering it. He reviewed activities conducted over seven days, spoke to NSS students on main objectives of the camp and emphasized the need to conserve water by judicious use. Further, he urged the students to take oath to conserve at least 4 to 5 liters of water every day. Later Dr. B. Jayashree, Principal of APS College, presided over the closing ceremony of the NSS program, referring to the saplings planted, urged the students to do plantation for the conservation of our environment. She expressed her opinion saying the awareness about this type of camps shouldn't be limited to the villages, but also must be spread to urban areas for successful implementation.
